- Foundational Logic & Mathematics: Participate in AMC 8, Math Kangaroo, or local mathematics challenges to build non-routine problem-solving agility.
- Exploratory Interests: Sample 3 diverse extracurricular clubs (debate, coding, environmental volunteering) to discover genuine intellectual passion.
- Study Habits & Time Management: Establish daily structured study routines and touch-typing speed.

1. Senior Year Execution Timeline

- November 1: Submit Early Decision (ED) / Restrictive Early Action (REA) applications to dream universities.
- December – January: Complete all Regular Decision (RD) supplemental essays and portfolio submissions.
- February – April: Complete alumni and technical admissions interviews. Evaluate financial aid and scholarship packages.
