1. Digital SAT Format & Multistage Adaptive Testing Mechanics

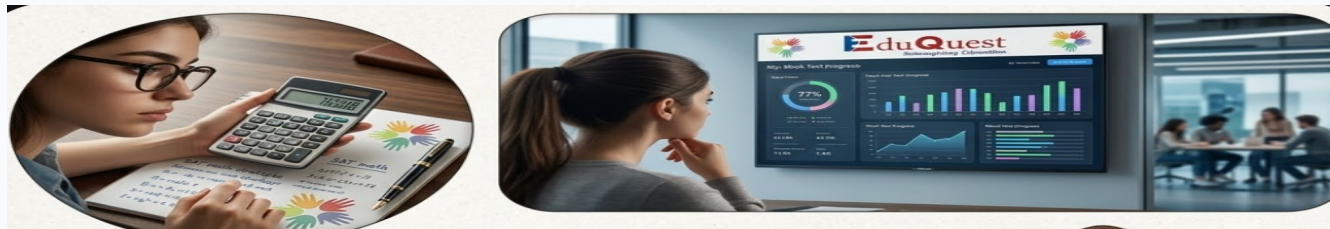
The Digital SAT is a computer-adaptive exam administered via College Board Bluebook. The test is split into two sections: Reading & Writing (RW) and Math. Each section contains two distinct stages (modules).

- Module 1 (Routing Module): Contains a balanced mixture of easy, medium, and difficult questions.
- Module 2 (Adaptive Module): Your raw score on Module 1 determines whether you are routed to the Upper Module 2 (Score ceiling 800) or Lower Module 2 (Score capped at ~590).
- RW Timing: 2 Modules × 27 Questions in 32 minutes each = 54 questions in 64 minutes (~71 seconds/question).
- Math Timing: 2 Modules × 22 Questions in 35 minutes each = 44 questions in 70 minutes (~95 seconds/question).

2. The Penalty of Early Mistakes & Scoring Algorithm

Because Module 1 acts as the routing gatekeeper, missing 3 or more questions in Module 1 can prevent you from unlocking the upper module, permanently capping your sectional score. In the Upper Module 2, the scoring curve is more forgiving for occasional hard mistakes.

■ The 1550+ Scoring Rule

To achieve a 1550+ score, you must score 25+/27 in RW Module 1 and 21+/22 in Math Module 1 to guarantee entry into the highest scoring band.

Module 2: Reading & Writing: High-Yield Grammar & Sentence Structure

1. Boundaries & Punctuation Rules

Grammar accounts for ~30% of the RW score. Master these core mechanics:

Grammar Rule	Correct Usage Structure	Common SAT Trap
Independent Clauses	Clause 1; Clause 2 OR Clause 1. Clause 2 OR Clause 1, and Clause 2	Comma splices: joining two independent clauses with only a comma.
Non-Essential Modifiers	Subject, modifier phrase, verb OR Subject—modifier phrase—verb	Using one comma and one dash to enclose the same modifier.
Colons & Dashes	Independent clause : Explanation / List / Emphatic word	Placing a colon after an incomplete sentence or after 'such as' / 'including'.
Subject-Verb Agreement	The group of scientists (prepositional phrase) IS publishing findings.	Matching the verb to the nearest plural noun inside a prepositional phrase.
Pronoun Ambiguity	Pronouns (it, they, this) must have one clear, singular/plural antecedent.	Using 'they' or 'this' without an unambiguous preceding reference noun.

2. Rhetorical Synthesis (Bullet Notes)

Read ONLY the final sentence prompt (the actual question). The prompt defines the exact goal (e.g. "emphasize a difference between two studies"). Pick the single option that fulfills this goal directly without reading the bullet list.

Module 3: Reading & Writing: Information, Ideas & Logical Transitions

1. Logical Transitions Master Framework

Identify the exact logical relationship between sentences before reading the answer choices:

- Continuation / Addition: Furthermore, Moreover, In addition, Similarly (Use when Sentence 2 extends the exact premise of Sentence 1).
- Contrast / Reversal: However, Nevertheless, Conversely, Despite this (Use when Sentence 2 introduces a limitation, contradiction, or unexpected outcome).
- Causation / Consequence: Consequently, Therefore, Thus, As a result (Use when Sentence 2 is the direct consequence of Sentence 1).
- Exemplification / Restatement: For instance, Specifically, In other words (Use when Sentence 2 provides a specific case study of Sentence 1).

2. Scientific Data & Graphs Triage

Read the graph title, axis labels, units, and legend first. Identify the independent variable (X-axis) and dependent variable (Y-axis). Eliminate choices that contradict graph values or make unsupported extrapolations.

Passage Type	Key Focus Area	Distractor Elimination Rule
Science Experiment	Independent vs Dependent Variables	Eliminate claims that reverse cause and effect.
Humanities / History	Author Thesis & Rhetorical Purpose	Eliminate choices that are overly extreme (always, never).
Literature / Poetry	Tone, Metaphor & Character Shift	Eliminate options using literal interpretations of figurative language.

Module 4: Math Section: The 4 Core Domains & Problem Triage

1. The 4 SAT Math Content Domains

College Board divides Math questions into 4 defined areas:

Domain	Question Weight	Key High-Yield Concepts
Heart of Algebra	35% (13–15 Questions)	Linear equations, inequalities, systems of linear equations, slope-intercept, absolute values.
Advanced Math	35% (13–15 Questions)	Quadratics, polynomials, exponents, radicals, rational expressions, nonlinear functions.
Problem Solving & Data	15% (5–7 Questions)	Percentages, ratios, rates, unit conversions, probability, scatterplots, margin of error.
Geometry & Trig	15% (5–7 Questions)	Circle equations, arc length, right triangle trig, volume, special triangles, similarity.

2. Two-Pass Math Section Pacing

Pass 1 (0–22 mins): Rapidly solve questions 1 to 16. Flag difficult problems. Pass 2 (22–35 mins): Dedicate deep focus and Desmos verification to the final 6 advanced questions.

Module 5: Top 10 Desmos Calculator Power Hacks

1. High-Yield Desmos Keystroke Cheat Sheet

Every math question on the Digital SAT allows the built-in Desmos calculator. Use these shortcuts:

Problem Type	Desmos Input Command	Speed Advantage
System of Equations	Type equation 1 on line 1, equation 2 on line 2; click intersection	Finds (x, y) solution in 4 seconds with zero substitution error.
Quadratic Vertex & Max/Min	Type $y = ax^2 + bx + c$; click the apex point on curve	Coordinates (h, k) appear instantly.
Linear Regression (Best Fit)	Add table (x1, y1); type $y1 \sim mx1 + b$ on line 2	Calculates exact slope m and y-intercept b instantly.
Equivalent Expressions	Type original as $f(x)$; type choices as $y = g(x)$	The graph that overlays $f(x)$ perfectly is the correct answer.
Unknown Constants (k, a, b)	Use built-in slider feature; slide until target condition matches	Solves tangent/intersection problems without discriminant algebra.
Mean / Median / Stats	Type $\text{mean}([data])$ or $\text{median}([data])$ or $\text{stats}([data])$	Calculates summary statistics instantly.

1. Error Classification Protocol

Categorize missed questions as Cat A (Knowledge), Cat B (Careless Slip), or Cat C (Pacing Panic):

Q#	Section & Topic	Error Cat	Time Spent	Why Did I Choose the Distractor?	Specific Rule / Shortcut to Fix
1	RW - Transitions	Cat B (Slip)	40s	Rushed; picked 'however' without reading Sentence 2.	Label relationship (Contrast vs Cause) before viewing choices.
2	Math - Quadratics	Cat A (Knowledge)	1m 45s	Forgot vertex formula $x = -b/(2a)$.	Input quadratic directly into Desmos and click apex.
3	RW - Punctuation	Cat B (Slip)	35s	Used semicolon between dependent and independent clauses.	Verify complete subject+verb on both sides.
4	Math - Circle Eq	Cat A (Knowledge)	1m 30s	Forgot completing the square for radius r^2 .	Group terms and add $(b/2)^2$ to both sides.
5	RW - Words in Context	Cat A (Knowledge)	50s	Unfamiliar with secondary definition of 'compromise'.	Look for context clue synonyms in adjacent sentence.
6	Math - Exponents	Cat B (Slip)	1m 15s	Multiplied exponents instead of adding them.	Review index laws $a^m \cdot a^n = a^{m+n}$.
