Action: Wrote and self-published a book on mental health for teenagers

Impact: Sold 1,200+ copies → Spoke at 3 schools → Started a mental health club with 200 members

- I have created measurable impact (numbers, outcomes, reach)
- All my activities connect logically to one central narrative
- I can tell a compelling story about my journey in under 60 seconds
- I have demonstrated leadership, not just participation
- I have at least one signature project or achievement
- My spike is something unique — it stands out from other applicants
- I have sought feedback from mentors or counselors
- My essays reinforce and deepen my spike narrative
- I genuinely care about this area — and it shows
