### SECTION 3

## ROI Calculator — Know the Numbers Before You Apply

ROI (Return on Investment) is the single most important financial metric for Indian families investing in US education. Use this manual calculator to compare your university options before spending a rupee on applications.

#### STEP 1

#### Calculate Your Total Investment

Total Cost = (Tuition + Room & Board + Living Expenses) × 4 Years

Ivy League estimate: \$80,000/yr × 4 = \$320,000 (~2.7 Crore)

- Key focus: Build profile spikes NOW if you're in Class 9–11 to maximise scholarship chances

#### **BUDGET: Above 60L/year (2.4 Cr+ total)**

- All options are open — this is the budget range for genuine Ivy League consideration
- Primary targets: Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Columbia, MIT, Stanford (non-Ivy but elite)
- Still apply to 3–4 top public universities as strong backup options
- Strategy: Invest heavily in profile building, essay coaching, and early application strategy
- Important: Even at this budget, acceptance is not guaranteed — profile and narrative are everything

## 7 Costly Mistakes Indian Students Must Avoid in 2026

Students borrow 2 Crore for a degree that leads to a 50L/year job. Do the math before you apply. A UC Berkeley CS degree often delivers better ROI than several Ivy degrees.

#### **Applying Only to Ivy League Schools**

**3**

With acceptance rates of 3–8%, applying to only Ivy League schools without strong target and safety schools is a recipe for receiving zero admit letters. Diversify your list.

4

**Starting Profile Building in Class 12**

Top US universities want to see 4+ years of consistent extracurricular engagement, growth, and leadership. Starting meaningful activities in Class 12 is too late. Begin in Class 9 or earlier.

5

**No Financial Planning or Loan Strategy**

Many families discover scholarship and loan requirements only after receiving an offer letter — by which time negotiation options are limited. Plan your financial strategy 2 years ahead.

6

**Weak, Generic Application Essays**

Sending the same essay to every university, or writing generic 'I want to make a difference' essays, is an admission killer. Each university's supplemental essays must be carefully personalised.

7

**Ignoring English Proficiency Tests**

TOEFL, IELTS, and Duolingo scores are mandatory at most universities. Not preparing adequately — or missing deadlines — disqualifies even strong applicants automatically.
